





### Magicians and Entertainers Needed A Commemorative Vietnam Veteran's Welcome Back



### **Gregory Wilson Lecture**

Gregory Wilson hasn't been on the lecture tour circuit since 2018. During that time, he continued to refine, hone, and perfect some of the most commercial magic that magicians can carry. He calls this new tour, "Things I Carry And Use 2.0". Some of the material may seem familiar, but he has some new twists that are worth your time and attention.

Here is a rundown of what will be in his lecture:

- Point Blank 2.0 If Greg could do one single card trick for the rest of his life, this multiphased blank deck performance piece would be it!
- MasterCon A two-card transposition with very realistic credit cards for you to commit the perfect crime.
- High Roller A realistically motivated Sach's dice routine with the dice changing over and over to crush any casino Craps game.
- Inner Circle This normal-looking finger ring is an engineering masterpiece that allows you to perform transpositions, translocations, penetrations and mid-air finger stabs.
- Pointless 2.0 Just like Greg's apparently impromptu classic, there are now two added phases with a grand finale that happens in a spectator's hand.
- Kiss Up This is the perfect opener and giveaway where a sugar packet cleanly changes into a Hershey's chocolate Kiss.

With an emphasis on non-cards, there is a little something for everybody from close-up to standup, beginner to expert — and plenty of impromptu miracles throughout.

Ring 1's Board decided that our club should begin offering Magic 101 again. For the March 5 meeting, Steve Finkelstein volunteered to lead the group. This special teach-in event was offered before the regular meeting. Approximately 10 members arrived an hour early to take advantage of the opportunity. Steve taught them two very easy, but amazing, effects. All attendees were able to perform the effects when they left. Steve even created a handout for each attendee explaining the effect in case they forget or need to review. He received many compliments regarding the effects he taught. The Ring intends to offer Magic 101 in the future when time permits.

Members are always happy to perform for the Ring. However, the club has been SO busy sponsoring lectures and hosting special activities that there is usually a very limited opportunity. Michael McClure decided to create an Open Mic Night to be held in the place of one of our regular meetings. We were delighted when 15 members offered to perform an effect (and there was a waiting list). Sandy Weis was asked to emcee the event. It was just like the Oscars or the Academy Awards—she even had an official script to read although she was told that she could alter/modify the script if she wanted. The room was filled -- the largest crowd the Ring has seen in a long time -- and there were attendees that the Ring has not seen in "years." It was obvious that all the performers had practiced their routines, because everyone appeared as if they were seasoned, professional magicians. The following members performed: Steve Queen, Paul Gregor, Columbus Smith, Gary S. Chan, Zai Shi, Josh Weidner, D. Jay, Zi Teng Wang, Jeff Lefton, Matthew Horowitz, Steve Finkelstein, Steven Buesking, and Christian Misner. No act was alike; all performances were unique. Several of the presenters were professional magicians; however, newer members were also asked to perform. Special thanks to Michael W. McClure for organizing a very classy event. Even though he did not perform that night, his organizational skills helped to make this event a huge success. He prefers to serve as more of a "behind the scenes" member, to allow others' talents to shine, even though he knows so much about magic theory and effects. He and his wife, Susan, brought their own backdrops, lighting, and provided video, audio, a close-up camera with projector and more, which made the performance area appear as if it were a stage production. He even made a cardstock program featuring photos of all the night's entertainers, which he passed out to all in attendance. Mike also created a special commemorative pin which was awarded to each Very Important Prestidigitator in appreciation of their participation. Thank you, thank you, Mike, for all you have done for the Ring. Since the evening was so successful, the Ring has already planned to host more Open Mic Nights this year.

Our Ring is proud to have recently reorganized ourselves as a 501(c)(3) non-profit, public charity incorporated in the State of Missouri. ### In Memory of Jack K. Greenberg

Jack K. Greenberg Past International President 2000-2001 International Brotherhood of Magicians

Jack K. Greenberg, of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, passed away on March 6, 2025, three weeks shy of his 95th birthday. Mr. Greenberg was born and raised in Pittsburgh. He was the valedictorian of his of Taylor Allderdice High School graduating class in 1948, and he received Bachelor's and Master's degrees from the University of Pittsburgh. Mr. Greenberg served on the faculty of the University of Pittsburgh Graduate School of Business during five decades, beginning in 1958. His classes and areas of expertise included Personnel Administration, Employee Selection, and Employee Relations. After working for American Institutes for Research, he founded and ran Measurement Services Incorporated, a firm focused on human behavior measurement and evaluation, occupational testing, hiring processes, labor relations, and training development.

Jack and his wife were consistent attendees of the Midwest Magic Jubilee in St Louis. It was one of his favorite conventions. When he was a very young boy, he became interested in magic. His mother, Anne Greenberg, was in charge of starting a school for the arts at Beth Shalom Synagogue in Squirrel Hill when she hired a pair of brothers to start the synagogue's dancing school. One of the brothers, Fred Kelly, had taught the other, older brother, Gene, to dance. (Yes, that Gene Kelly.) The two were excellent dancers and teachers, but Fred was also a working magician who performed throughout Pennsylvania, Ohio, and West Virginia. Young Jack Greenberg was already interested in magic when, after a dancing class, Fred showed him some magic... and the little boy went from interested to obsessed. Fred and Gene Kelly remained close friends with the Greenberg family through the rest of their lives.

By the time he was fourteen, he was a member of the International Brotherhood of Magicians (I.B.M.), the world's largest organization of magicians. Local chapters of the I.B.M. are called "Rings," and Pittsburgh's Ring was known as "Tampa Ring 13," after a world-renowned Pittsburgh magician whose stage-name was Tampa. Jack quickly became one of the most active and integral members of the Ring, and he ran the Junior events when the annual convention was held in Pittsburgh in 1947.

During college at the University of Pittsburgh, Jack played trumpet in the marching band, and stayed on the band's staff during graduate school as the "Drill Master," the person who created and taught the marching formations for the halftime shows. He worked in the same capacity with the Mount Lebanon High School Band, taking them to twice to the Tournament of Roses Parade. His love of march music kept him active in the Pitt Alumni Band into his later years.

But Jack's involvement in magic never stopped. As a young man, he performed as a recurring character, a "Magical Milkman," with Fred Rogers and Josie Carey on WQED's The Children's Corner. He remained in contact with Mr. Rogers, who called him occasionally with questions about magic and magicians.

Jack was a member of the I.B.M. for eighty magical years, and was elected to be the I.B.M. International President from 2000 to 2001. At the I.B.M. Annual Convention in 2023, the Ring 13 membership announced the renaming of the Ring to Tampa-Greenberg Ring 13, in his honor.

Jack will be missed by many in the St Louis area and around the world. The impact he had on people's lives will never be forgotten.

Jack's beloved wife of 61 years, Carole, passed away in 2021. He is survived by his son Don, Sharon daughter-in-law, his daughter Diana, and his granddaughter Anna. He will be missed by family, friends, and magicians around the globe.






